SCANDIC HOTELS' ACCESSIBILITY STANDARD

Scandic has a 159-point Accessibility Standard to ensure our hotels are accessible to all.

We drew up the standard after carefully following the way guests move from the parking lot into and throughout our hotels. We also spoke to disability organizations and guests with physical disabilities and welcomed ideas from observant Scandic team members. Although we normally rent our hotels instead of owning them, there is a lot we can do to make them more accessible. Of the 159 points, 105 are compulsory for all hotels, and all 159 points apply when we renovate or build new hotels.

The standard applies in all countries where we operate. And naturally, we comply with legislation in each

Our standard doesn't include everything we do to make our hotels accessible. Accessibility is ingrained in our daily work, in all areas. This means, for example, that we include safety issues related to accessibility in our safety standard. In other words, accessibility is an important aspect of Scandic's concept and everyone on our team undergoes accessibility training.
